
1) Expanding the reach of our mission: New members

Since 2010 IAOS has kept in general a steady growth of its membership, increasing members on average by 5.7% annually during 2010-2017.

In the first year of the Strategic Plan 2017-2019, IAOS members increased by 29%.


492 are individual members (92%) **45** are institutional members (8%)




IAOS Biennial Conference

Aim: Provide a forum for the analysis and discussion of the most relevant issue of official statistics.



- Call for papers: Very positive response. A total of 227 proposals.
 - SPC decided to increase the number of sessions originally planned to accommodate as many relevant papers as possible.
 - In total, more than 130 speakers were allocated slots to present their research on official statistics.
 - 20 poster session presenters.
- Special topic sessions:
 - Trust;
 - Indigenous Statistics;
 - Drug Statistics
 - R&D Statistics and Innovation.
