## Advocate



## ... and engaged in Asia-Pacific and SIDS

- ☐ 50 countries in Asia-Pacific and SIDS
  - 17 in Asia (7 Southeast Asia, 8 South Asia, 2 others)
  - 33 in SIDS (15 Pacific, 13 Caribbean, 5 AIMS)
- ☐ Areas of statistical support
  - NSDS
  - NSS institutional strengthening and coordination
  - Data management
  - Statistical advocacy

(in countries PARIS21 worked with)

- 16 countries in Asia with statistical legislation
  - √ 75% updated on or after 2000
  - ✓ 13% are over 50 years old
- 31 SIDS countries/territories with statistical legislation
  - √ 42% updated on or after 2000
  - √ 10% are 50 years old

- Key elements in statistical laws
  - ✓ NSO as leading authority in the NSS (mandate to coordinate and set statistical standards; main producer of official statistics in the country)
  - ✓ Professional independence of NSO
  - ✓ More prominent role of Chief Statistician/Head of NSO
  - ✓ Wider access to administrative data and other data sources by
    NSOs (including NSS data sharing and exchange)
  - ✓ Access to public use files for research purposes

- Unique elements in statistical laws
  - ✓ Preparation of medium-term national statistical plan/strategy (i.e., Philippines)
  - ✓ National government as principal source of budget for statistics (i.e., Vietnam)
  - ✓ Preparation of annual budget for statistics integrated in government agency budget (i.e., Cambodia)
  - ✓ National indicators defined (i.e., Vietnam)
  - ✓ Horizontal and vertical coordination of the NSS (i.e., Lao PDR)
  - ✓ Support of military/police in the conduct of surveys (i.e., India)

- Regional perspectives:
  - ✓ CARICOM Statistics Model Bill serves as reference in updating statistical legislations in the region
  - ✓ ASEAN Community Statistical System and CARICOM has adopted respective Statistics Code of Practice

## **NSS Coordination (Principle 8)**

- 41% (7) in Asia and 27% (9) in SIDS provide for establishing statistics council/committee/advisory board in the statistical law
  - ✓ Policy-making body
  - ✓ Technical coordination
- Other organizational arrangements are in place to coordinate work in the NSS
  - ✓ Standard-setting and "clearing house" function of NSO
  - ✓ Horizontal and vertical coordination in the NSO and NSS.
  - ✓ Cross-posting of NSO staff in other Ministries
  - ✓ Interagency working groups on thematic concerns

## **NSS Coordination (Principle 8)**

- National Strategy for the Development of Statistics (NSDS) as a coordination mechanism for NSS
  - ✓ engage data producers and users in the development and implementation of high-quality plan and make strategic choices for statistical development
  - ✓ set priorities for data production and dissemination aligned with national development priorities
- NSDS status in Asia and SIDS
  - ✓ Implementation: 65% in Asia; 21% in SIDS
  - ✓ Development: 12% in Asia; 18% in SIDS
  - ✓ Expired: 12% in Asia; 9% in SIDS

## Use of international standards (Principle 9)

- International standards on national accounts
  - √ 100% (17) in Asia
  - ✓ 79% (26) in SIDS
  - ✓ Of which, 77% (33) 1993 SNA version and 21% (9) use 2008
- Other international standards used
  - ✓ Standard classifications: industry, product, occupational
  - ✓ Economic statistics: BPM, MFMS
  - ✓ Census recommendations adopted (UN, CARICOM, Pacific Community)

## Use of international standards (Principle 9)

- Data dissemination standards subscribed
  - ✓ GDDS 9 Asia, 22 SIDS
  - ✓ SDDS 4 Asia, 1 AIMS
- National Data Archives
  - ✓ Asia 11 Asia
  - ✓ SIDS 13 Pacific (through Pacific Community's PRISM), 2 Caribbean and 3 in AIMS (NSO-based)

## International cooperation (Principle 10)

- Areas of cooperation
  - ✓ Capacity building and development
  - ✓ South-south learning and exchange
  - ✓ Global discussions
- Value-added of international cooperation
  - ✓ NSS institutional strengthening and enhancement
  - ✓ Development in domain-specific statistics (e.g., economic, social & demographic, etc.)
  - ✓ Improved data quality, harmonized and comparable statistics

## International cooperation (Principle 10)

- Regional statistical cooperation (UN ESCAP, ECLAC, ECA, ASEAN, SAARC, SPC, CARICOM, OECS, AFRISTAT, AUC)
  - ✓ Statistics governance mechanism (i.e., steering committee)
  - ✓ Regional strategy for the development of statistics or RSDS
    - ACSS Strategic Plan 2016-2020
    - Ten Year Pacific Statistics Strategy 2010-2020;
    - SAARC Statistics Action Plan 2000-2015;
    - Strategy for Harmonization of Statistics in Africa
  - ✓ Regional statistical training program (i.e., SIAP)

## International cooperation (Principle 10)

- Committed funding for international statistics cooperation (PARIS21 Partnership Report on Support to Statistics)
  - ✓ USD 470 M total support to statistics for 2014
    - 30% (USD 141) demographic & social statistics
    - 27% (USD 128) economic statistics
    - 22% (USD 104) general and methodological issues
    - 7% committed to Asia-Pacific region
  - ✓ 72% of 2014 total commitments in 2014 provided by Canada, European Commission/EUROSTAT, FAO, IMF, WB

# Challenges in FPOS implementation

#### **Challenges in FPOS implementation**


- Significant number of countries with statistical legislations needing updates
  - ✓ Strengthen role of NSO and ensure its professional independence, stature of Head of NSO
  - ✓ Institutionalize NSS coordination and clarify responsibility of data producing agencies
- Statistics and policy link still weak and greater data use need to be extensively promoted
- Clear provisions for use of alternative data sources for official statistics still absent

#### **Challenges in FPOS implementation**

- Subnational statistics under-developed and linkage with national statistical system weak
- Statistical standards not widely adopted in NSS (especially other agencies)
- International cooperation needs to be systematic
